NOMINATION PROCESS

The rules for nomination of a telecommunicator are as fol-

- · The nomination will be presented by an APCO Chapter, not the nominee's agency. The only exception to this will be if a nominee does not have an APCO Chapter in his or her state, or is from a country without an APCO Chapter.
- · A nomination form must be filled out completely and returned to the Chairperson of the Operating Procedures & Training Committee. The nomination form and rules can be obtained from the Membership Department at APCO Headquarters (800-824-1850).
- · Include with the nomination all available documentation of awards and commendations received by the nominee.
- · Submit any newspaper articles, magazine articles, and tape transcripts to support the nominee's incident, etc.
- · All nominations must be turned into the Chairperson of the Operating Procedures & Training Committee by June 1.

If a fellow employee of the nominee is a member of the APCO Operating Procedures & Training Committee, or if a member of the Operating Procedures & Training Committee is nominated, that Committee member will abstain from voting on the award selection.

CPRA Chapter Donates To APCO Building Fund


