Barbara Delgado of the Anaheim Po-


lice Department sang the National Anthem, and APCO Past President Gary David Gray of Orange County Communications gave the invocation. After dinner, the 12 awards were presented.

Outstanding Performance Award winner Jackie Noel of the Ventura County Fire Department was honored for a call she handled. During the beginning stages of the Malibu fires, she received an enhanced 9-1-1 transfer from the California Highway Patrol. The reporting party was calling on a cellular phone and said he was trapped in the fire area and was in desperate need of emergency help. She remained on the phone with him while another county dispatcher contacted Los Angeles County Dispatch to have equipment respond to his location.

For more than 50 minutes, Jackie stayed on the line, instructing the caller what to do to save his life while the county was trying to get assistance to him. The fire had destroyed his home and he was told to find safety and refuge in his empty swimming pool. When the fire overran him, the cellular connection was terminated.

Due to Jackie's quick thinking early in the conversation, she had learned the

She then paged him and much to her relief he called her back hours later. His gratitude was immeasurable, and he attributed his life to her calm handling and decisive instructions.





gettable events, forever touching the lives of everyone involved.

Linda remained on the phone for more than 40 minutes with the reporting party, and all the while the husband could be heard firing shots in the background. At one point, he came to the phone. Extremely agitated and emotionally distraught, he told Linda he is "gonna kill his wife" and "I'm gonna get killed or I'm gonna kill tonight!" He refused to talk further. Upon the deputies' arrival, the open phone line revealed a single shot, then a series of gunshots. Linda's unfailing calmness contributed greatly to the ultimate success and low number of injuries of this incident.

## Nicole Bavis

Nicole Bavis was honored as the Supervisor of the Year. During 1993 the Redondo Beach Emergency Communications Center was going through a process of selecting a new manager. One of the department's lieutenants acted as interim manager. Without time to prepare for a new manager, the department's preparations fell entirely on the supervisory staff, chiefly on Nicole, as the administrative supervisor.

She quickly familiarized herself with the manager's duties and then broke in the interim manager who had no communications background. When the new manager was named, she also broke in that person and assisted in implementing a new training program for communications operators. The overwhelming success of the training program resulted in a drop in the turnover rate from 35% to 10%.

Melissa Smith of the Santa Ana Police Communications was honored as Dispatcher of the Year – Runner Up. She was honored for consistently performing at a level exceeding job standards and being a hard-working telecommunicator who always displays a professional and positive attitude.

### Carol Advocate

Carol Advocate of San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, Needles, was honored as Dispatcher of the Year – Honorable Mention. She joined the department 19 years ago and over the years had demonstrated the skills and personal qualities necessary to be an excellent telecommunicator. Carol's professional demeanor and confidence in the knowledge of her job let the deputies know that someone is there to help them.

## Johnna Carter

Johnna Carter of Oxnard Police-Fire Communications was honored as Outstanding Performance – Runner Up. December 2 began as a routine morning until 11:39 a.m. when the first calls of a gunman in the Employment Development Department were received.

During the next 25 minutes, more than 100 calls were handled while listening to gunshots over the phone and victims pleading for help. By 12:05 p.m. three citizens had been injured; the suspect, three citizens and a police officer were dead. She continued to do her job in an outstanding manner and continued to be a professional in spite of having to deal with the personal grief and stress of losing a friend and co-worker.

## Suzanne Adams Kelly Duncan

Suzanne Adams and Kelly Duncan of Laguna Beach Police-Fire Communications were honored for Outstanding Performance – Runner Up. On October 27, Laguna Beach experienced a fire that required no less than 61 strike teams of 2,000 firefighters and 313 police officers from surrounding agencies. Through the first hours of this incident, both Suzanne and Kelly exemplified the ultimate professionalism any agency could ask of its workers in assuming the arduous role of a telecommunicator.

## Sheila Haley

Sheila Haley of Los Angeles Police Communications was honored for Outstanding Performance - Honorable Mention. Last August 20th, about 11:15 a.m., a patrol unit reported following a stolen UPS truck used earlier in an armed robbery. The officers cornered the truck in an alley and went in foot pursuit. The two officers became separated and were fired upon. Many other units responded. After setting up a perimeter, Sheila directed units to a tactical channel. Her quick actions and calm control of this incident contributed to the apprehension of both suspects.

## **Cherry Teter**

Cherry Teter of the Los Angeles Police Department was honored as Supervisor of the Year – Runner Up. As officer in charge of the training unit for communications, she and her staff revised, published and initiated training for the division. She also revised the communications manual to be more user-friendly and efficient. Her motivation and leadership are reflected in the high quality and large amount of work being processed through the training unit.

#### Mila Smith

Mila Smith of the Los Angeles Police Department was honored as Supervisor of the Year – Runner Up. She supervises employees who answer emergency calls, dispatch and monitor patrol units, handle service requests and complete telephonic reports.
