The California Public-Safety Radio Association, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as CPRA) was originally founded on January 9, 1935 at Glendale, California as a statewide group called the California Police Radio Association. Because California is so large, it was decided in 1941 to divide the state between North and South. A line was drawn from east to west through Fresno. The group to the north of Fresno was known as the Northern California Police Communication Officers. This group is now known as the Northern California Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials or NAPCO. The group south of Fresno was at first known as the California Police Communication Officers but shortly afterward the Southern California group changed the name back to the original California Police Radio Association (CPRA). On April 1, 1945, CPRA became the 13th chartered chapter of the then Associated Police Communications Officers (APCO), officially becoming the Southern California Chapter of APCO. Since it was a separate organization that predated APCO when it joined in 1945, the Chapter's corporate name, California Police Radio Association, Inc., was allowed to be grandfathered. In 1953 the Southern California Chapter, in order to better reflect its membership, changed its corporate name to the California Public-Safety Communications Officials, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as APCO). All other present and future chapters are now required to use APCO in both their chapter and corporate names.

Today, the Southern California Chapter of APCO is made up of over 600 local volunteer public safety professionals from Police, Fire, EMS, 9-1-1, State/Local Government, Tribal, Military, Forestry, Highway and Conservation services who volunteer their time and expertise for the betterment of public safety communications. It represents more than 250 Public Safety agencies and 9-1-1 Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) who serve over 23 million people throughout Southern California. Our Corporate members, who provide products or services to public safety, also support and participate in many of the activities of the Chapter. The Southern California Chapter of APCO meets monthly in various Southern California locations.

The Southern California Chapter of APCO is an all-volunteer 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable organization which provides its members with Operational and Technical education and training, discusses the current critical issues affecting Public Safety and 9-1-1 PSAPs, disseminates the latest information on emerging technologies including Next Gen 9-1-1 and FirstNet, reports on FCC Regulatory notices and actions, conducts monthly Frequency Coordination meetings, advises on the current activities at APCO International, and provides an opportunity for networking with peers. Additionally, the Chapter holds special events throughout the year, including: an Annual Public Safety Awards Banquet in April that recognizes the top 9-1-1 Practitioners & Technologists in Southern California; an Annual California APCO State Training Conference & Exposition in October that provides 3 days of professional development training and displays the latest equipment and services for Public Safety; and an Officer Installation Dinner & Holiday Celebration in December.

It is my honor to submit the 2024 Annual Report on behalf of APCO's Southern California Chapter (CPRA) Executive Committee and our Chapter membership.

As we represent approximately 220 PSAP's in Southern California, we continued to host monthly membership and Frequency Coordination meetings throughout the various counties. We do this to give our members more opportunity to attend the in-person meetings.

In February, John Wright replaced Ernest Gallo as our Chapter Webmaster, and with the assistance of the NAPCO Chapter webmaster; he created a brand-new Chapter Website. The new chapter website is now found at https://SoCalAPCO.org. The new site has a SSL certificate and has the "https" secure site indicator that shows the site is secure when downloading documents or doing business at the Chapter online store. Our old website at www.cpra.org site was not secure.

Also in May the Chapter Quorum approved a new position of Social Media Coordinator to facilitate the Chapter's Social Media presence in areas such as Facebook, LinkedIn, and Group Email blasts to the membership. Liza Kester, UC Santa Barbara PD, was appointed by the Executive Committee to fill the position and she has been hard a work keeping the membership up to date on the latest activities.



The Financial Summary contained within this report reflects all financial activity of the CPRA Chapter of the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials (APCO) – International for its 2022 fiscal year:

CPRA is an IRS designated 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable organization. TIN #: 95-4234700.

Accounts: US Bank Non-Profit Organization Checking; US Bank Business Visa Credit Card.

Credit Card processing for payments to the chapter is provided through US Bank and Square. All Square credit card transactions are direct deposited into the Chapter's Non-Profit Checking Account. Additionally, the Chapter utilizes Zelle to accept mobile payments to the Chapter. All Zelle transactions are direct deposited into the Chapter's Non-Profit Checking Account. Other than for issuing electronic refunds for payments already received by the Chapter, no outgoing payments are allowed utilizing Square, Zelle, Cash Cards, Gift Cards, or Bank Transfer.

Payments: All outgoing payments are limited to Chapter Check, Chapter Credit Card, or Petty Cash only.

APCO Dues: Association dues designated for the CPRA Chapter are direct deposited monthly from APCO International into the Chapter's Non-Profit Checking Account. CPRA is an APCO Tier II dues chapter.

Assets: Per Chapter Financial Policy, equipment valued at \$500 or greater is determined to be an "Asset" of the Chapter and therefore reportable to the IRS. Equipment value is depreciated annually at the current IRS published depreciation schedule. Chapter equipment valued below \$500 is determined to be a non-asset item and is tracked in separate inventory records. Equipment depreciated to zero (\$0.00) value is not reflected in this report.


